GSTC Criteria

The GSTC criteria are the minimum efforts that any tourism management organization needs to achieve when considering sustainability in their practice. To meet the definition of sustainable tourism, destinations must take an interdisciplinary, holistic and integrative approach that includes four main goals:

- (i) Sustainable Management: Demonstrate sustainable destinations management;
- (ii) Socioeconomic impact: Maximize economic benefits to the host community and minimize negative impacts;
- (iii) Cultural impacts: Maximize benefits to communities, visitors, and culture; minimize negative impacts; and
- **(iv) Environmental impacts**: Maximize benefits to the environment and minimize negative impacts.

GSTC Criteria

Two sets of GSTC Criteria:

1. GSTC Industry Criteria (for Hotels and Tour Operators)


This set of Criteria relates to the sustainable management of private sector travel industry, focusing currently on Hotels and Tour Operators.
