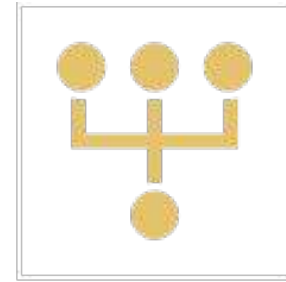




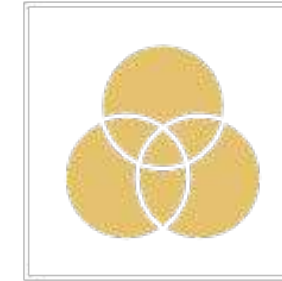

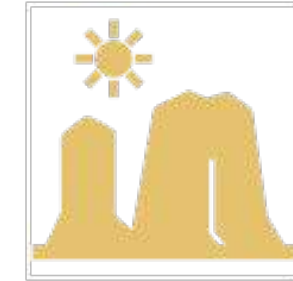

ACCESSIBILITY - Trentino Open

The I Suoni delle Dolomiti Festival has a special focus on inclusivity.

Specifically, four concerts allow people with disabilities to enjoy a unique experience surrounded by the beauty of the Dolomites.

People with motor disabilities have access to a dedicated chaperone service from the parking area to the concert venue. This service is provided by trained personnel and supported by sustainable, inclusive transportation options.

People with hearing impairments can enjoy full immersion in the event thanks to the Italian Sign Language (LIS) interpretation service and to the Subpac: a high-tech backpack that uses an audio-tactile system to transfer a low-frequency response directly to the listener's body, for a unique sensory experience.

CARRYING CAPACITY AND HOTSPOT MANAGEMENT: A DATA DRIVEN PROJECT ON THE MOLVENO AND TENNO LAKES

Tourism Carrying Capacity is defined by the World Tourism Organization as:

The maximum number of people that may visit a tourist destination at the same time, without causing destruction of the physical, economic, socio-cultural environment and an unacceptable decrease in the quality of visitors' satisfaction.

CARRYING CAPACITY AND HOTSPOT MANAGEMENT:

A DATA DRIVEN PROJECT ON THE MOLVENDO AND TENNO LAKES

Study Subject: assessing the carrying capacity of Molveno and Tenno Lakes, perceived as tourist hotspots

Study Methodology: analysis of concrete data, including: Lake visitors' questionnaires, ISPAT and ISTAT data, Vodafone Analytics data, car and people counting sensors, surveys carried out by APPA and QSA about noise pollution and air quality, parking data analysis

Aim of the study: to develop or refine a new lake management model that preserves a high-quality guest experience while also safeguarding the local environment and enhancing the quality of life for residents.

CARRYING CAPACITY AND HOTSPOT MANAGEMENT:

A DATA DRIVEN PROJECT ON THE MOLVENO AND TENNO LAKES

Study outcome:

1. There is currently no significant drop in guest satisfaction
2. There is currently no 'urgent' environmental degradation
3. The lakes experience high visitation from day trippers and destination guests alike. The combined influx often leads to peak times that can strain the system.
4. There is still ample room for distributing flows over June and September
5. An excessive number of people are arriving at the lake by car, with traffic and parking issues now being critical concerns also by local community

Next steps:

Gathering community feedback

Study of the parking reservation system and improvement of the road system

Implementing seasonal adjustments
